Failure to appoint more than one individual within the factory and office areas could lead to a situation arising whereby no competent persons are available to attend a casualty due to a) them being absent from work or b) them being the casualty. This could lead to severe time delays occurring in the implementation of basic first aid being given	6	4	FSC1 will continue to manage their duties regarding all H&S matters with a view to go beyond the legal requirement. In this case, the training of multiple individuals within the office and factory areas of work in first aid will be completed. These individuals will be on hand to assist the appointed first aider and/or provide cover when this individual is not present.	1	1
